PROFILE

Dimitrios holds post-graduate qualifications in Sensory Integration from Sensory Integration International in the United States of America and from the Sensory Integration Network UK & Ireland. He is an Advanced Sensory Integration practitioner and certified in the administration and interpretation of the Sensory Integration and Praxis Tests (SIPT). He has been involved with mainstream children with learning and autistic spectrum disorders.

Dimitrios worked for the London Borough of Hillingdon for two years where he set up a specialist Sensory Integration Service in a primary school. This involved assessment, treatment and follow-up services for children with underlying sensorimotor disorders.

In September 2005, he became a member of the executive committee of the SI Network UK & Ireland with responsibility for education and research. In October 2005, he started lecturing on a part-time basis at Brunel University in West London and joined Hopscotch in December 2005. In September 2006, he became a director of Hopscotch and in 2009, he completed studies in the field of Anthropology of Childhood & Child Development at Brunel University. In the summer of 2010, he was elected a Fellow of the Royal Society of Medicine, and in 2016, he completed studies in Neurosciences at King's College London, Institute of Psychiatry.

Dimitrios has been involved in academia since 2005 and started his career as a lecturer at Brunel University – Division of Occupational Therapy. Between 2005 and 2013, he was a lecturer with the Sensory Integration Network UK & Ireland. In 2008, he established training modules in Sensory Integration that have taught globally the topic to professionals in the field. This work keeps growing and he has also presented several workshops and lectures on topics such as Autism, Dyspraxia, ADHD and Early Intervention.
